
Cut the rectangles out and fold on the dotted lines.


Glue the back of the folded rectangle to the file folder.

Note: The photo shows this lapbook used as the standard file folder. It can also be folded and used like a standard lapbook.

Page 2 is the front cover and can be used as a poster.

Page 3 is the inside. Glue the title to the top middle section. The pictures can be placed where you like as fillers.

Page 4-5 Cut around the solid rectangle pictures, and fold on the dotted center lines. The back will be glued to the inside. Students will look at each Disciple, and lift the flap, and write about each Disciple on the inside.

Page 6 is optional and if you decide to add the Apostles, they can be glued to the back if necessary.

The bottom photo is the basic placement I used before these updates (so the pictures do not look the same). The great thing about lapbooks, is you can place and glue them however works best for you! There is not a right or wrong way.
